5. Inculcate right values in students for their holistic development


# **Trainings and Workshops**

**A REPORT ON CBCS WORKSHOP**

The workshop on Choice Based Credit System and Credit Framework for skill based vocational courses was conducted on 10 April 2015 at Mumbai. This was organised by University Grants Commission and Mahatma Gandhi Antarrashtriya Hindi Vishwasvidyalaya, Wardha, (Maharashtra). Mr. Vijay Bhushan from Kalinga had participated in this workshop. Shri Sanjay Gawai , Registrar cum Finance Controller, MGAHV, was the Nodal Officer of the workshop. At the onset he briefed about the workshop. Inauguration of the workshop was done by Prof. Girishwar Misra, Vice-Chancellor of the organising university. Prof. Rajan Bherukar ,VC, Mumbai University gave his welcome note. The first presentation was given by Prof. H. Devraj, Vice-Chairman, UGC. Then the session was taken by UGC Experts- Prof. M.P.Mahajan & Prof. Shrimant Narayan. The concluding remarks of the forenoon session and vote of thanks were given by Prof. Arvind Jha. Afternoon session started with the presentation by AICTE Expert Dr.

Aakash Rathore, Director- Tech. Education on Credit Framework. Next presentation was delivered by UGC Officer Dr. Nikhil Kumar on Skill Based Schemes and Credit System. Subsequently the presentation was delivered by NSDC representative Dr. Ashish Batra. Open discussion sessions were also there. Concluding remarks by experts was given in order to sum up the presentations and discussions. Vote of thanks by UGC Nodal Officer was given. This workshop was primarily called for sharing an idea of UGC with all the universities. Moreover they have not made it mandatory to implement it; rather they have thrown the ball in the court of VCs to take their own decision. It is so because universities differ from one to another in terms of evaluation patterns, dates of evaluation and many more things. The college wise **basket of choice** for optional courses within the university can be feasible. But if the student

opts for an option from other university then n-number of issues needs to be matched.



## **WORKSHOP ON EXAMINATION REFORM SYSTEM**

A workshop was conducted on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2015 at Govt. Nagarjuna Model Science College, Raipur on Examination Reform System. This workshop was attended by Mr. Vijay Bhushan on behalf of Kalinga University. Prof. Kallol Ghosh was the Chief Guest of the program and all the senior professors were among the eminent speakers.

The UGC has initiated several measures to bring equity, efficiency and excellence in the higher education system of the country. The important measures taken to enhance academic standards and quality in higher education include innovation and improvements in curriculum, teaching-learning process, examination and evaluation systems, besides governance and other matters. The academic reforms recommended by the UGC in the recent past have led to

overall improvement in the Higher Education System. However, due to lot of diversity in the system of higher education, there are multiple approaches followed by universities towards examination, evaluation and grading system. The reputation and value of one institution differs from another. The student securing lesser % from one university gets privilege in the market than the one who has secured distinction and honours from other university. This is because of the difference in the skill inculcation within the students. UGC also realizes that the 85% students are unemployable despite having a good marks and high % in their exams. So it wishes to correlate the skill with the grade system.

## VISIT TO NEHRU YUVA KENDRA (NYK)

A visit to Nehru Yuva Kendras, Sahu Complex, Tikrapara, Raipur, (CG) was done on 30<sup>th</sup> March 2015. Ms Anita Verma, Asst. Professor, Physics Department and Mrs Payal Verma, Asst. In the year 1987-88, Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS) was set up as an autonomous organization under the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, to oversee working of these Kendras. It channelizes the power of youth who are in the age group of 13 - 35 years on the principles of voluntarism, self-help and community participation. Over the years, Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan has established a network of youth clubs in villages, where Nehru Yuva Kendras have been set up. NYKS has targeted to identify areas of harnessing youth power for development by forming Youth Clubs, which are village level voluntary action groups of youth at the grassroots level to involve them in nation building activities.


