Q.1:





Chart 1: The course objectives were clear.

It was found that a majority of students (55%) have agreed strongly that the objective was clear. Whereas 1471 students have also believed that the objectives of courses were clear to them. Thus it can be concluded that most of the students stated that course outcomes were fulfilled through the content delivery and practical exposure.

Action Taken:

• Since there was positive feedback from the students, no action was initiated.

- Motivation session was conducted for the students by experts.




Chart 3: Course out comes were fulfilled

When the students were asked a question whether the "Course out comes were fulfilled" then 58% of them strongly agreed, 37% said it has fulfilled very much, 5% agreed. Thus it seems that almost all students stated that the course outcome was fulfilled.

• The syllabus has been revised keeping in consideration the feedback.




Chart 4: The learning and teaching methods encouraged participation

Total 41% of the students responded "Strongly agree" when they were asked a question whether the "The learning and teaching methods encouraged participation", 35% "very much agree", 24% "agree", almost 0% "somewhat agree". Thus a satisfactory number of students believed in the improved participation.

Action Taken:

- The reason behind selection of 5 students who agreed somewhat were analyzed.
- The departments were instructed to conducting Workshops and arranging Motivational Talks for the students on regular basis.




Chart 5: Subject topics are relevant to correct industry requirement

When the students were asked a question whether the "Subject topics are relevant to correct industry requirement" then 44% of them responded "Strongly agree", 37% "very much agree", 19% "agree", only a few students opted "somewhat agree".

Action Taken:

The 5 student's feedback who have rated "Neither agree nor disagree" were analyzed HoD's are asked to review the syllabus as per industry need if required.




Chart 6: How do you rate the list of experiments for the laboratory courses in relation to real life applications





When the students were asked a question that "How do you rate the course outcomes for the laboratory courses" then 58% of them responded "Strongly agree", 35% "very much agree", 7% "agree", only 2 students "somewhat agree. So the course outcome of laboratory was highly satisfactory to students.

Action Taken:

• The requisite modifications have been done in the syllabus of Lab subjects for acquiring theoretical knowledge along with its practical applications as well.




Chart 8: How do you rate the evaluation scheme designed for each of




Chart 9: The teacher uses modern teaching aids, Notes, suitable references, PowerPoint presentation, web resources etc.

When the students were asked a question about the teaching pedagogy then 61% of them responded "Strongly agree", 30% "very much agree", 9% "agree", 0% "somewhat agree". Thus it seems that almost all students admitted that teacher's uses modern teaching technique.

Action Taken:

- The department was requested to look into the observations made by the students over teaching aids.
- Informed individual course faculty in person to use ppt.




Chart 10: The Syllabus has a good balance between theory and practical application

When the students were asked about the "Syllabus balance between theory and practical applications" then 54% of them responded "Strongly agree", 43% "very much agree", 23% "agree", 3% "somewhat agree" and 1% "Neither agree nor disagree". As to conclude 99% of students affirmed that there is balance between theory and practical applications in the syllabus being taught to them.

Action Taken:

 The departments were requested to look into the observations made by the students over balance between theory and practical applications. If needed syllabus revision can be done.




Chart 11: The methods of assessment were reasonable




Chart 12: The feedback process is fair and unbiased
